Opening Question: Growing up, did your parents treat you differently than your siblings? If so how?

Chapter 7

Read Numbers 7:1-9

- How were the carts and oxen divided up among the Levities?
- Why do you think the “sons of Kohath” were given nothing to help shoulder their responsibility for the tabernacle (7:0)?
- How would you apply the rule regarding the “sons of Kohath” to the Church or Christians today?

Read Numbers 7:10-17.

- Each tribe brought exactly the same thing. Why is this important?
- What is the significance of the altar being dedicated?

Read Exodus 40:34-35 and Numbers 7:89.

- How are these two verses different?
- What has happened between the end of Exodus 40 and Numbers 7:89?
- How would you apply this to the gospel?

Chapter 8

Read Numbers 8:9-12

- Why does the whole congregation lay their hands on the Levites? Why do the Levites then lay their hands on the heads of the bulls? What is happening here? How does this relate to the Gospel?

Read Numbers 8:14-18

- Why does God separate the Levites out from the rest of Israel based upon this passage? How does this point to the Gospel?

Numbers 9

Read Numbers 9:1-2

- What is the passover? Why was it important to be celebrated? How is the passover event kept as a reminder throughout the year?
- How does the passover point to the gospel?
